- a) When more than one cabin crew member is *required*, the composition of the cabin crew shall include a senior cabin crew member nominated by the operator.

For (CAT) single CCM ops

- ORO.CC.255(b)(1) & (c) additional training
- ORO.CC.100(c) one crew member *nominated* to be responsible to the pic



All CCM (incl. SCCM) must be present unless:

- Unforeseen circumstances if number of pax is reduced (report to CA)
- Normal ground ops (A/C parked & no re-/de-fuelling); and

Conditions

- Procedures to ensure safety AMC1 ORO.CC.205(c)(1)
- SCCM* ORO.CC.200
- 1 CCM per 50 or fraction of 50 per deck
- 1 per pair of floor level exits if A/C requires more than 1 CCM

* ORO.CC.205(e) in case of sudden incapacitation of SCCM



ORO.CC.215(c)

- Structured & realistic training
- Trainers appropriately qualified for the subject

- Competent to perform duties:
ORO.CC.110(a)(3)
- Crew qualified: ORO.GEN.110(d)
- Maintaining personnel trained and competent
to perform their tasks: ORO.GEN.200(a)(4)

- Familiarisation under supervision

Objective

- Competent to perform duties:
ORO.CC.110(a)(3)
- Crew qualified: ORO.GEN.110(d)



(c)

- Approval of training programmes & use of FSTDs

Objective

- Crew qualified: ORO.GEN.110(d)

- Crew qualified
- Personnel properly instructed

ORO.GEN.200

- Identification of aviation hazards and management of associated risks
- Maintaining personnel trained and competent
